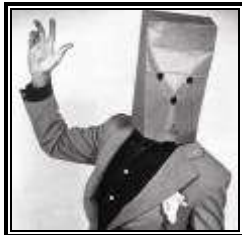

Important Notice to Parents: Team Placement Policy

We do not grade players at Albany Creek. It is the policy of club to **try** to place players according to the individual requests of the player. If no special requests are made, the player will be placed in the appropriate age group.

To make it easier for existing players to register for the next season, we mail out registration forms in mid-to-late July each year. The forms are pre-filled with player details and there is always a Special Requests line on the form so that parents or players can make requests for where they would like their son or daughter placed in the coming season, for example:

- *'same team as last season'*
- *'with Matthew Hayden'*
- *'with players from All Saints school.'*

The mail package also includes details of when the sign-on is taking place etc. You don't have to physically come down to the club to register - you can mail the forms to the club's postal address (PO Box 82, Albany Creek) with payment.

Towards the end of each season, we publish the dates for the sign-on for the next season in our Hawk Talk newsletter. We also put a reminder in there to ask parents to advise us if they have or will be moving in the off-season so that we can alter our database, thus ensuring the mail out will go to the correct address.

As we grow bigger each year, the administrative task of organising the teams becomes more difficult. At the beginning of each season, our Registrar invests a huge amount of time reviewing all the requests and allocating players to teams. This starts on sign-on weekend and continues over the next several weeks, with new registrations and late registrations coming in right up until (and sometimes after) the first game of the season.

The process of sorting the teams is long and involved and once started, it is very difficult to move players out of one team into another. We also have to work around deadlines for nominating teams to Brisbane North.

We now have over 350 players to try to keep happy, therefore if registrations are not received on the sign-on weekend, or the Registrar is not advised by the parent of their intent to return and their requested playing arrangements, special requests will **only** be met if it there is room in the nominated team.

GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

Any Cricket problems? All Committee phone numbers are on page one of the newsletter.

You have all had time to settle in and see how your team is going. Are there any problems? Please don't think now the season has got underway that you are on your own. Phone or see any one of the Committee or if a parent, please approach your coach and we will try and fix what we can.

Helmet policy

It is **Club policy** that each batsman **MUST** wear a Safety Helmet when batting. Should a parent not wish for a player to wear a helmet, then a signed written advice must be forwarded to that player's coach that absolves the Club from any possible damages claim from injuries received whilst playing or training, caused by not wearing a helmet. The form, to be completed by each parent, is available from your Coach and/or Manager. If you choose to sign an indemnity, you need to ensure that you are present at the game when your child is batting.

Also, a new rule has been introduced by **Brisbane North** that states that a wicket keeper **MUST** wear a helmet if they are keeping up to the stumps regardless of the style of bowling. Signing the above indemnity does not override this rule.

Safety – Hot & Wet

It looks like this summer may be Hot, so please ensure you have the players' interests at heart when you are deciding whether they should leave the field for a spell or not. Remember that the player safety is paramount. Make certain the players use sunscreen and wear a wide brimmed hat and take regular drink breaks. If it is too slippery or dangerous to play, please come off the oval and wait for a while, or if necessary, abandon the game. Don't put the players at risk.

Batting Gloves and Protectors

Zone rules 2.2 (d), (e), (f), (g) & (h) require that each player must wear protection when batting – helmets, pads and gloves are available in each kit but players must have their own personal protector.

Coach Responsibilities

The Coach runs the team. He or she is responsible for preparation of the players and control during the matches. Batting and bowling orders are the coaches' responsibility. It is recommended that from Under 13, a captain is appointed to run the team, particularly when fielding. The Club expects ALL coaches to have the Level O certificate or the BNJCA basic level. It is the coach's responsibility to get an indemnity signed by the parent/guardian when a player chooses not to wear a helmet.

Manager Responsibilities

The Manager assists the coach with team administration. He or she should ensure that rostered parents are available for Canteen duty and to act as Umpires, Scorers, assisting players getting ready etc. Managers are responsible for publication and the recording of team results, ensuring abstracts are submitted to the relevant statistician and to ensure the Player of the Match nomination form (U11 upwards) is sent to Brisbane North Junior Cricket Association at PO Box 178 Zillmere 4034



NETS USE

The ovals we use are shared with other SPSA member clubs, at various times during the week. This is especially the case with the Thunderbirds Model airplane club who use oval 1 **on Wednesday until 3.00pm and on Sunday afternoon**. We **cannot** use the practice nets on oval 1 during these times. Please do not try and use them, as you will be asked to leave the area by the Thunderbirds members. The nets on oval 2 are available for use.

KEEP YOUR HOME CLEAN

The amount of litter left behind by teams at Brendale is staggering. Even if it is the opposition team, please ensure that you clean up your area after the game and don't leave cans, paper, wrappers etc. behind. There are garbage bins near the

canteen and also near the shade shelters, for your use. This also applies when you have AWAY games.

NO BASEBALL CAPS to be worn onto the field!!

Wet Weather Procedures

In cases of general cancellation of all Zone matches due to wet weather, an announcement is usually broadcast over the radio by **4QR (612 Mhz) 7.00 am – 7.30 am on game days**.

In all other cases, please ring your coach and they will advise you if the game is going ahead. Often this decision can't be made until they have actually gone to the ground and a decision will then be made after inspection of the oval.





HOW ARE THE WINNERS OF TEAM TROPHIES DETERMINED??

We like to remind everyone at the start of the season about how the trophy winners are determined for the team awards. So here's the drum:

At the end of the season, there are three trophies awarded for each team:

1. Batting Award
2. Bowling Award
3. Coaches Award

In the past there has been some confusion as to how the winners of these trophies are determined. Set out below are the basic guidelines used to determine the winners:

1. The Batting Award is always decided first.

The best average is used to determine the winner in senior grades [U11 – U16] while the junior grades [U8 – U10] are determined by the best aggregate total {unless there is a draw, in which case averages will be used to determine the winner}. For senior grades, this player **MUST** have played in 50% or more of the team matches and be in the top 50% of run scorers.

2. The Bowling Award is decided next. [The winner of the Batting Award is not eligible for this award.]

Again, the best average is used to determine the winner in senior grades [U11 – U16] while the junior grades [U8 – U10] are determined by the best aggregate total {unless there is a draw, in which case averages will be used to determine the winner}. For senior grades, this player **MUST** have played in 50% or more of the team matches and be in the top 50% of wicket takers.

3. The last award decided is the Coaches Award. [The winner of the Batting or Bowling Award are not eligible for this award.]

This award is decided by the Coach (and may be given for any reason what so ever).

For example, the Coach may decide to award it to a player who may not have been amongst the best batters or bowlers but had displayed a great attitude towards the game, his team and his coach, both on match day and at training.



The Batting Average is calculated by dividing the number of times the batter has been out into the total runs scored for the season e.g. 125 runs divided by 5 “outs” will give an average of 25.0.

The Bowling Average is calculated by dividing the number of wickets taken by the bowler into the number of runs scored against. e.g. 100 runs against divided by 5 wickets will give an average of 20.0.

INDIVIDUAL TROPHIES!!

There are also lots of other trophies award for certain milestones and events. For example:

- Hat Tricks
- 5 or more Wickets in an Innings (U11-U16)
- 4 x 50 runs in an innings (U11-U16)
- Centuries
- 50 Wickets in junior (U8-U10) or senior (U11-U16) age group
- 1,000 Runs in junior (U8-U10) or senior (U11-U16) age group
- Cricketer of the Year (U11-U16)
- Half-Season Cricketer of the Year (U11-U16)

Significant milestones and events are also tracked in our Honour Board. This is a wonderful living file that records an archive of our clubs history, including the top 10 junior and senior batsmen and bowlers for the season.

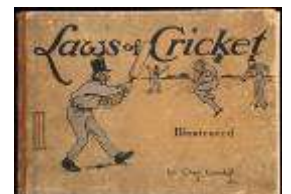

Some Cricket Trivia:

The game of Cricket is believed to have been invented by English shepherds in the 17th century. The batsman would bat in front of a tree stump with a curved piece of wood. Over time as the game developed, the batsman would stand in front of a wicket-gate.

Early bowlers would bowl under-arm, because over-arm bowling was illegal. Kent cricketer John Willes first introduced over-arm bowling to the game. He learnt this skill from his sister Christina, who found that her skirt would get in the way when she tried to bowl under-arm.

The first rules of cricket were written in 1774 and have been changed numerous times. The only law that remains unchanged today is the length of the pitch, at 22 yards.

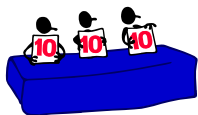

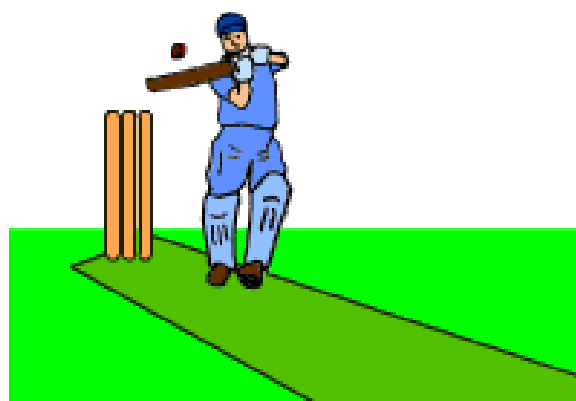

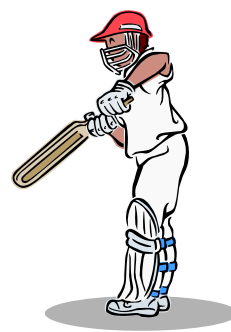
